Analysis :

----- in some literary writing, dots or points were used to indicate divisions. Prepositional Phrase Subject Verb

So, we need a conjunction. Only option 4 is a conjunction. Others are *Preposition*.

Analysis : Lack of a verb for the subject (4) After the blank space, we are of the direct object. So we don't need a passive verb. (2 & 3)

So, we need a conjunction. Only option 2 is a conjunction. Others act as a regular adverb at the beginning of a sentence. *(conjunctive adverbs)*

Analysis :

**Ducks have been domesticated for many centuries** and (they= Ducks) are raised commercially for their meat and eggs.

Parallel Structure with two simple sentence (or independent clause). Moreover, we don't need to an additional verb. (4) Also, we don't need to a relative clause (which/that are raised) or a reduced relative clause because mostly the relative clause describe the noun (or noun phrase) before itself.

Ducks have been domesticated for many centuries raised ....

So, this interpretation is completely wrong because it is meaningless! (1 & 3)
